



Some Policy & Procedure Reminders

EE2s & Excursions

West Lothian Council Policy states that children require to have an EE2 completed for any excursions to allow them to attend. Please ensure you complete, sign and return any EE2 forms before the date of the excursion as these need to be checked and processed. We re-

alise that it is time consuming and often these things can be overlooked. We will continue to send a reminder if forms are missing but if children do not return their EE2 following this reminder they will be unable to attend the excursion and will need to remain in school.

Medications in School Policy

WLC policy states that we cannot administer medication without a completed medication form. We ask that you bring any medication to the school office and complete the relevant form. Please do not send your child to school with medication or leave this in the school office in the morning. If you are dropping your child off at breakfast club, please speak to Mrs Jones or another member of staff in the Breakfast club and they will issue the appropriate form



staff in the Breakfast club and they will issue the appropriate form and will pass this and the medication on to the office staff.

Clothing

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It is our policy to ensure children have access to outdoor play at break and lunch times unless the weather is extremely inclement.

Due to the current wet and windy weather children may get wet and muddy. If possible, we would appreciate if parents could send additional tights, socks and trousers in schoolbags to change into if needed. We do have some spare items of clothing but this stock is limited. Thank you for your help with this.

Scottish Poetry Competition


The Scots theme doesn't end there because our annual Scottish Poetry competition will be taking place on 12th February. Children were all sent home with their poems to choose from and will be heard in class by Thursday 6th February. This will enable us to choose finalists to go forward to perform in front of our invited guests. Councillor Lawrence Fitzpatrick and Darren Phillips, Youth worker from the local church, will be attending as judges.

Bellsquarry Learning Update

Two of our Primary 7 children were given the responsibility of collating some information about learning taking place in classes across the school.

Primary I

In Literacy, the children in PI have been learning about the 'ee' sound and practising their tricky words. They have been learning about their number bonds to 10 and counting in twos. They have also been very busy practising for their Scottish assembly.



Primary 2/1



In Numeracy, P2/I pupils have been learning how to half and double numbers using near doubles to help them. They have been learning how to plan their writing, using their plan to write a narrative text about life on a deserted island. They have also

been learning about how to use coordinates and legends to draw and read maps in their Katie Morag topic.

Primary 3/2

The children in P3/2 have been using similes in their sentences as well as focusing on their handwriting and presentation. In Numeracy & Mathematics the children have been learning about time, multiplication and some have even been tackling division. They are learning about Scottish Castles and have been enjoying learning about different the parts of a castle.

Primary 3

The children have been busy in P3 learning about measure, shapes, subtraction and division as well as their times tables. In Literacy they have been looking at Scots language through 'The Gruffalo'. They have been learning French vocabulary and have been enjoying learning about Robert Burns and tartans in their Scottish topic.

Primary 4

P4 writing has consisted of writing fairy tales. They have been learning about when to double a consonant in words (e.g. hopping) and when to use speech marks and speech bubbles. They are working hard at more complex times tables such as 7, 8 and 9 and using their knowledge of times tables to learning about division. They have been reading non fiction texts, taking notes and sharing them with their reading groups.

Primary 5

In Numeracy, the children in P5 have been building upon their subtraction skills. In mathematics the children have been weighing using standard metric units. In literacy they have been reading and writing Scottish poetry. They have been improving their research skills by researching the saints. In Health and Wellbeing they have been learning about regulation strategies and resilience.

Primary 6

In Numeracy, P6 pupils have been learning mental and written methods for multiplication. They have been learning about Scots

language and writing narrative texts: imaginative writing and poetry. They have been strengthening their research skills and using what they find out to create information booklets.

Primary 7

Primary 7 pupils have been researching and gathering information to plan and write an information report. They have enjoyed making 3D shapes using a drawn net and working through algebra equations to find the value of a letter. They have made resilience videos about the ups and downs of life (using either people or puppets!). In PE they have been learning how to dribble in hockey and football (through FUTSAL) as well as Scottish Country Dancing.

Teaching Staff Update

It was Mrs McAdam's last day today (P3/2 teacher on a Mon Tues). She has secured another teaching job in the authority and we wish her well in her new post. The job has been advertised is currently live on myjobscotland with a closing date in the middle of Feb. Interviews need to be held and then the successful candidate will need to go through notice period and completion of references etc. Mrs Gilmour will continue to teach P3/2 on a Wed Thurs Fri. Mrs Smith, SfL teacher, will cover in P3/2 Mon Tues for the first 2 weeks followed by a supply teacher after the February break. The supply teacher we have arranged to cover is a retired head teacher, Joan Naysmith. Plans are in place to make the transition as smooth as possible.

Office Staff

Mrs MacDougall finished up at Bellsquarry on Friday 10th January and we have a new Clerical Assistant, Mrs Pow. She is settling in well and is being trained by Mrs Marra.

Teaching Students

We have a couple of teaching students with us at the moment. Mr Drysdale is a teaching student who is currently working with P7 until the end of February and will be working with P3/2 after Easter.

Mrs Scobie started this week in P3 and will also be with us until the end of February.

ELC Staff

Mrs Shona Todd is our new EYO who started in the ELC on 13th January. We are loving having her as a new member of the ELC team!

Mrs Anthoney is still working within our ELC but in a new role as Early Years Practitioner.

Parking Issues



In case you are not already aware, parents are no longer permitted to use The Elm Tree car park to park/drop off/collect. I am told there used to be an unwritten arrangement that parents could use the car park for drop offs and collection. However, the owner has experienced various issues as a result of this and asks that the car park is no longer used by parents/carers for dropping off and collecting of children. This car park

is the property of The Elm Tree and they reserve the right to limit parking to staff and customers only.

There is ample street parking around the community but we ask that all parents are mindful of our neighbours, moving their cars if they are causing an obstruction and please switch off car engines when stationary.

We do have a breakfast club open inside the school from 8:00am and supervision in the playground is available from 8:30am every morning. This provides a large window to drop children off, removing the pressure to wait in cars until 8:50am and reducing the amount of traffic at 8:45—8:50. Thank you very much for your understanding and cooperation with this matter.
