



World Book Day

Our Literacy Ambassadors have been busy planning and preparing for World Book Day. They are organising a **Book Swap**. Pupils have been bringing in books for our book swap which will take place on **Wednesday 4th March**. We are grateful for any donations of additional books, especially for P4-7 age group to ensure we have a variety of books available for the children to swap. **Reminder: this is a permanent swap so children should not bring in a book they would like back**. Thank you for your support.

We will be celebrating World Book Day itself on Thursday 5th March. All pupils from Nursery—P7 will be issued with a World Book Day token. The token may be used for £1 off a book or audiobook costing £2.99 or more from participating bookstores until the 29th March. On Thursday 5th March we will be having a dress down day. We ask for a donation of £1 from pupils who participate. This money will go towards school funds which subsidises school excursions and other events in the school.

Bellsquarry Learning Update

Please read below for an update on some of the learning taking place in each of the classes:

Primary 1

PI pupils have been looking at what Fairtrade means and why it is important. After discussing their favourite foods, children are going develop their researching skills with their P7 buddies to find out where their favourite food comes from. With World Book Day approaching Primary I pupils have designed their own book based on



the story 'Mrs Mole I'm Home' written by Jarvis. After investigating animals that live underground, Primary I pupils are going to design their chosen animal a home using a range of materials and present at our World Book Day celebration assembly.

Primary 2/1

P2/I has enjoyed a great start to 2020! Pupils have been working hard across all areas of the curriculum. In Maths and Numeracy, we have been looking at time and data handling. We are very keen to get our new narrative writing illustrated and on the wall. It was fun using our imagination to create a story about being stranded on a deserted island. This was a great link to our Katie Morag topic after our assembly about the Isle of Coll.

Primary 3/2

The children in P3/2 have now finished their castles and they look great! We have started our Habitats topic and enjoyed learning about how different animals are suited to their habitats. We worked in groups to write reports and demonstrated good team work, supporting and helping members of our team.



Primary 3

P3 pupils have been busy learning how to tell the time using quarter to and quarter past. They have been reading the novel 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' which they all are very much enjoying. This novel is being used as a focus for their reading and writing skills and is also being used to help develop their creative art skills. In P.E, they have been learning ball control skills with hockey sticks and were able to participate in teams in a mini tournament.

Primary 4

P4 have had a very exciting month! They presented their Fairtrade learning at the recent P4 Cluster Assembly and enjoyed the walk in the sunshine. They have been learning about life cycles and survival of fish through their Fish in the Classroom project. Sadly they only have a small number of fish left but they are still looking after them well! In Maths, they have been subtracting lots of different numbers and in Literacy they have been learning how to write an information report. They have really enjoyed their first Move to the Beat workshop and look forward to having one every Thursday.

Primary 5

P5 pupils have been very busy! In Numeracy and Mathematics, they have been looking at times tables and using their measuring skills to find the perimeter of rectangles and triangles. In Literacy, P5 have been learning how to take notes and then using their notes to write reports about classes of passengers on the Titanic! Speaking of the Titanic, they have been investigating how different materials float and sink in science and are planning on using their knowledge to build their own boats that float. P5 pupils have also been enjoying their weekly 'Move to the Beat' workshop where they are learning to move their bodies and sing.

Primary 6

In Mathematics, P6 pupils have been extending their measuring skills e.g. measuring perimeter of irregular shapes using different units of measure. They learned lots about Fairtrade and then taught the rest of the school about what they had learned through their assembly last week. They have also been busy learning as many facts about Europe as possible. The children who had the most varied



knowledge about Europe will go forward to the Euro Quiz next week. We wish them luck!

Primary 7

Primary 7 pupils have been revising persuasive techniques to allow them to plan and design posters about Fairtrade products. In Maths, they have enjoyed learning about angles, compass points and directions. They have been continuing to develop skills in Hockey and are transferring these into games. As part of JHYS Science Fair, pupils have been busy planning science projects to present in a couple of weeks.



Games Club

As part of our Health & Wellbeing improvements, we have recently started up a Games Club twice per week at lunch times. This provides children with a different social experience in a quieter environment as it is currently limited to approx. 10-12 P4-7 pupils. We have consulted a group of children about the kinds of games they would like to have available to make it even more appealing and enjoyable.

Starting next week I will be Acting HT at Bellsquarry Mon-Fri. We said farewell this week to Mrs Robertson who has been a wonderful support to the school over these past 7 weeks on Wednesdays. On behalf of the Bellsquarry community we would like to thank her for her time and support.

We have also advertised for an Acting Principal Teacher to help lead and manage the school. Mrs Ferguson, HT from Bankton Primary School will be assisting with interviews for this post. We will let you know as soon as we have appointed.

Teaching Staff Update

Mrs Robertson and I held interviews for the P3/2 class teacher post this week and I am delighted to announce that we have secured a permanent teacher called Mrs Coyle. Mrs Coyle, previously class teacher at Peel Primary, will be coming in to meet the children in the coming weeks and to have a handover with Mrs Gilmour and Mrs Naysmith. She will begin her post after the Easter holidays. We are very excited to have Mrs Coyle join the Bellsquarry team.

Mr Drysdale finished his placement in P7 today. Mr Drysdale will be re-joining us after Easter and will be joining the class teachers in P3/2. He has been along to meet the class this week and we look forward to welcoming him back to Bellsquarry. It was Mrs Scobie's last day in Primary 3 today. We have loved having her in Bellsquarry Primary School and wish her well in her future career.

Playground & Outdoor Play

We're sure that you will all agree that access to fresh air and outdoor play and outdoor learning has great benefits; it contributes to healthy bodies and healthy minds. Therefore it is our policy to ensure children have access to outdoor play at break and lunch times unless the weather is extremely inclement. This means that due to the continued wet and windy weather children may get wet and muddy. If possible, we would appreciate if parents could provide additional tights, socks and/or trousers in schoolbags to change into if needed. We do have some spare items of clothing but this stock is limited. Thank you for your help with this.

Flooding

You may have seen or heard that we have a problem with flooding in the school play-ground. We are reporting this issue to the council every time it happens and they have been sending teams to drain the water each time. We are hopeful that they will be able to discover what is causing this continued issue and that it will be resolved soon. However, one of our parents is a drainage specialist and has met with me to discuss potential solutions. We plan to get the children involved in learning about drainage systems and coming up with a solution which would prevent or reduce the amount of flooding we experience. We think this is a very relevant and exciting learning experience for the children which will put skills for learning, life and work into a very real context. We look forward to coming up with potential solutions together which the children can then present to the council. One of the ideas is running off some of the rainwater into planters so if anyone has the ability to build planters and would be willing to donate these or the materials or time please get in touch. A great Bellsquarry community effort!
