




Lack of resources?

We are delighted that most P1-3 parents have now signed up for online learning journals. We have worked our way through the consent forms received and set everyone up with an account where we have the completed consent form. If



P4 — 7 pupils have been working hard to develop their ICT skills! Teams is a wonderful way of learning online and staying connected as a class. So far pupils have learned:

- How to access and navigate Teams groups and channels
- How to communicate with others online effectively
- How to 'like' posts and tag people
- How to upload pictures and documents from a variety of devices
- How to use PowerPoint in different ways
- How to use immersive reader in Word online to read posts aloud
- How the internet works
- A basic history of the world wide web
- About people who have contributed to technology
- How to troubleshoot problems
- How to support each other online
- How to use GIFs and emojis to add meaning to posts/comments

Some of our next steps will be to learn and develop:

- Staying safe and healthy, physically and emotionally, when working online
- When and how to use emails appropriately
- Computer programming
- Knowledge of digital skills required for a variety of jobs
- Problem solving to maximise learning opportunities
- Using spreadsheets and databases
