What is our 24–25 PEF allocation?

This session our PEF allocation is £11025. 3% of this is being used towards participatory budgeting (£331).

Appointed promoted post holder will continue to oversee all equity priorities across the school this session and lead targeted interventions. We are also able to continue to appoint a pupil support worker (PSW) for 10 hours per week to carry out interventions with identified learners.

Highlights from last session...

- The new PEF planning tool was used effectively to identify gaps for learners impacted by poverty, to plan and design interventions to support them and together evidence of the impact on their learning.
- PEF was used effectively to recruit a PEF lead promoted post holder to oversee all equity priorities across the school, to provide training for staff in literacy approaches, use of assessments and analysis of results and plan interventions. We were also able to appoint a pupil support worker (PSW) for 10 hours per week to carry out interventions with identified learners
